Assessment

Total of 10-15 points: you are inclined to be a natural leader, and are not afraid of accepting a challenge, even if you have to do it alone. In the Bible, good examples of such leaders are Joseph and Elijah in the Old Testament, and Paul and Peter in the New Testament. Study their example because God can use you to accomplish great things in life, but you must be careful to ensure that you are hearing from God, and you must be willing to suffer being rejected, scorned and even persecuted by others.

Total of 16-24 points: you are inclined to be a willing follower – you want to do what's right, and work well with others, but you don't push yourself to the forefront. Some good examples in the Bible are Joshua and David in the Old Testament, and Mary and Timothy in the New Testament. Study their example because God is looking for faithful people to work as part of His team and be committed to follow the leadership of the Holy Spirit.

Total of 25-30 points: you are inclined to be a reluctant follower – you want to do what's right but often have doubts and uncertainties. Some good examples of famous Bible people like this are Moses and Gideon in the Old Testament and Thomas in the New Testament. Study their example because God is faithful to encourage us and also give us boldness to accomplish the task, once we take the first steps. God often chooses the most unlikely people to accomplish great tasks in His kingdom!
